- Cake mix and frosting make it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
- Dishwashing detergent is expensive and is always appreciated.
- Feminine hygiene products are a luxury and women will cry over them.
- Everyone lives Stove Top Stuffing.

Main point, do what you can. Pray for those who go hungry and without. Take the time to ponder what we take for granted. You don't have to follow this schedule, and there is not a specific number of items to donate. Any and all donations will be accepted. Know that anythi9ng is appreciated!
